




In order to carry out daily activities, a person needs to ingest 2,119 calories per day. The average monthly cost of these calories (food basket) was S/. 155 per month in 2013.

(Thousands)




Incidence of Monetary Poverty by geographic area, 2011-2013 (Percentage)


Incidence of Monetary Poverty by geographic domain, 2011-2013

Incidence of Monetary Poverty by region groups, 2012 - 2013






Incidence of Monetary Poverty by regions, 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013








The poverty gap is defined as the amount of spending that a poor person lacks to cover the cost of the basic consumption basket or to reach the poverty line. This figure has been decreasing steadily in recent years. Even though they have not been brought out of poverty, there has been an improvement in the living conditions of the poor.






Incidence of Extreme Monetary Poverty, 2009 - 2013 (Percentage)



Incidence of Extreme Monetary Poverty by Area of Residence, 2010 - 2013





Population with access to Public Water Supply, by Monetary Poverty Status, 2009 - 2013



Population with access to a bathroom connected to the sewage system, by Monetary Poverty Status, 2009 - 2013



Note: Bathroom: Including public sewerage inside and outside the house but inside the building.


Population with access to Electricity, by Monetary Poverty Status, 2009 - 2013
